## **Final Season in Oakland Won't Be Pretty**

The one word that best describes the Oakland Athletics' organization for the past two seasons is dysfunctional. Since trading Matt Olson, Matt Chapman, and other starters after the 2021 season, the product that Oakland has put on the field has been poor, to be kind. Ownership has seemed more concerned with cutting payroll and moving the team to Las Vegas than actually making moves to improve the team. With all of that in mind, the A's performance was expectedly terrible in 2023 as they went 50-112 and were eliminated from playoff contention before the end of August.

### Batting

There were a couple of bright spots for Oakland in their lineup through 2023; rookie second baseman Zack Gelof joined the team after the All-Star break and put up 14 home runs and 14 steals. Shea Langeliers was acquired from the Braves for Matt Olson and while he didn't have a good bating average last year, he did provide power with 22 homers. Brent Rooker got his first shot at regular playing time and put up a 30 home run season and should continue to be a power threat moving forward. Esteury Ruiz led the American League with 67 steals and is a capable defender in center field, though he doesn't provide much offensively other than his base running. Seth Brown and JJ Bleday will make up the rest of the Oakland outfield. Bleday is a former top five pick who hasn't yet lived up to his potential at the major league level, while Brown is a left-handed power threat.

First baseman Ryan Noda strikes out a lot and doesn't hit for average, but he does get on base a lot through walks and also has decent power. Abraham Toro is projected to start at third base and has bounced around to a few different teams throughout his career. Oakland is hoping that consistent playing time will help Toro to improve, as he debuted in 2019 and hasn't shown much with the bat to this point. Rookie Darrell Hernaiz will get a shot as the starting shortstop after having an excellent 2023 season in the minors, hitting .321 with 45 extra base hits and 13 steals. Utility man Aledmys Diaz doesn't provide much

with the bat, but he is a valuable defender off the bench who can play multiple positions. Oakland will also be hoping that Miguel Andujar, a former Rookie of the Year runner-up with the Yankees, can recover the form of his amazing 2018 rookie season and become a major league contributor once again. However, since a shoulder injury derailed his 2019 season, he hasn't had nearly as much success at the plate and he won't provide much defensively.

### Pitching

Oakland may have a glimmer of hope offensively, but the pitching staff is unfortunately another story. Athletics pitching was a total disaster in 2023, finishing last in the AL with an absurd team ERA of 5.48. The "ace" of the staff is JP Sears, a durable and decent pitcher who started 32 games last year, though he doesn't strikeout a lot of hitters and his 4.54 ERA was below league average. Paul Blackburn was an All-Star in 2022 and is another respectable pitcher, though he is similar to Sears with a low strikeout rate. Former Dodgers and Giant Alex Wood joins Oakland this year and he's been a decent pitcher throughout his career, though it has been a couple of years since he has been consistently effective. Ross Stripling is another newcomer to the staff. While he had a poor showing in 2023, as recently as 2022 he was a very effective pitcher for the Blue Jays. Luis Medina is a former highly ranked prospect but he had a rough debut in the majors last year.

Top prospect Mason Miller will likely get a shot at being the Oakland closer. Miller has a triple digit fastball but has struggled to stay on the field due to injury. Lucas Erceg strikes out his fair share of hitters but he also walks a lot of hitters and gives up a lot of contact. Dany Jimenez was a bright spot out of the bullpen with a 3.47 ERA in 23 innings at the end of the season. Scott Alexander has been a good pitcher out of the bullpen and as a spot starter in the past, though he joins Oakland after a rough 2023 campaign in San Francisco.

### **The Bottom Line**

2023 was a very rough year for Oakland and their fans and it's difficult to see how 2024 will be much better. Owner John Fisher continues to cut payroll to the bone and seemingly can't be bothered to even try to put a halfway decent team on the field. Even all of the trades that the A's made hasn't seemed to improve their farm system as they are still ranked towards the bottom of the league by multiple publications. The biggest news surrounding the Athletics last season was the revelation that possums are living in the press box as well as two "reverse boycotts" where fans packed the ballpark to protest ownership and demand that the team be sold to someone who cares. 2024 is very likely the last year that the Athletics play in Oakland. MLB owners approved a move to Las Vegas, but even that move is uncertain with stadium approval istill pending and the mayor being noncommittal at best.

Unfortunately, it looks like Oakland players and fans will have to go through another year dealing with one of the most incompetent owners in sports while hoping that they don't break the major league record for losses in a season.



### PROSPECT TO WATCH Mason Miller - P

Even though the A's have traded several big name players over the last couple of years, Oakland's farm system is surprisingly light on impact prospects. Mason Miller is currently the Athletic's #2 prospect per MLB Pipeline and he has shown a very good fastball and slider, with 69 Ks in 39 innings in his minor league career. Unfortunately, Miller has historically struggled to stay on the field due to injury, starting a total of only 21 games over the past three seasons. He did make six starts in the big leagues in 2023 with a very respectable 3.78 ERA. Oakland plans on using Miller as a reliever in hopes that he can stay healthy with a lower workload. With his triple digit fastball, he will likely get some save opportunities.
