THE BOTTOM LINE

Mike Norvell orchestrated a badly needed turnaround of the Florida State program. A program accustomed to bowl games on a yearly basis had suffered through three losing seasons in the last four seasons. Jordan Travis' play at quarterback was a big reason for the turnaround and he will have every opportunity to be a Heisman candidate next season. He threw 22 touchdowns compared to just 4 interceptions and is a threat with his legs, adding 7 more touchdowns on the ground. Oklahoma's season wasn't as successful in Brent Venables' first year. The defense didn't take the jump many thought it would and the offense was inconsistent at best when quarterback Dillon Gabriel missed time with injury. Eric Gray was excellent at running back (1,366 yards) but has opted out of this game. The absence means Gabriel will look to his favorite target Marvin Mims even more. Oklahoma was a little unfortunate to draw Florida State, as the Seminoles have a strong argument as the best ACC team this season.
