## **Rockies Outlook Rough in 2024**

Last season was as bad as Rockies baseball has ever been in the 31-year history of the franchise. Colorado finished with a record of 59-103, the most losses in the club's history and, unfortunately, the prognosis isn't much better in 2024 as the team made no major moves in the offseason. To be fair to the front office, they are faced with a unique challenge. Not only do they have to navigate the complexities of playing home games at altitude, but they are also staring up at the mega-spender Dodgers and San Francisco and San Diego haven't stopped spending, either. Oh, and the Arizona Diamondbacks reached the World Series. To this point, the 2021 trade of Nolan Arenado has not netted much of a return and the team's biggest signing in recent memory has struggled to even stay on the field.

### Batting

The player being eluded to above is, of course. Kris Bryant. The 2016 MVP and four-time All-Star with the Cubs has missed more games than he's played in a Rockies uniform. He played 80 games last season and struggled at the plate. The power that came so naturally early in his career has dissipated, leaving behind a slugging percentage of just .367. He has a lot to prove in 2024 as his 7-year, \$182 million deal is currently looking like one of the worst deals in baseball. Will that pressure help him perform or lead to additional struggles in 2024? The usually reliable Charlie Blackmon started showing his age, at least, in the games played department. However, he actually had a decent year at the plate when he did play including a four-year high in OBP which helps offset the absence of home run power in his late 30s. While the Arenado and Bryant deals have been less than ideal, the Rockies seemingly fleeced the Guardians in their trade for Nolan Jones, who posted very impressive numbers in his rookie season. Advanced analytics such as dWAR would tell you that Ryan McMahon is deserving of a Gold Glove in his trophy case. He could get it this year just like Brendan Rodgers did in 2022. Rogers was held to just 46 games in 2023,

however. Catcher Elias Diaz made his first All-Star team and casually won MVP of the All Star Game. Sean Bouchard has impressed in brief major league stints the past two seasons but injuries are an ongoing concern. Ezequiel Tovar's batting is still a work at progress but at just 22 year olds he's a borderline-elite defensive shortstop. Brenton Doyle earned a Gold Glove in center last year but needs to make progress in his plate discipline. If the Rockies feel like they need more offense in the outfield, they could turn to Sam Hilliard who is now in his second stint with Colorado.

### Pitching

To say that the Colorado Rockies pitching staff struggled in 2023 would be an understatement. Even taking Coors Field into consideration, the Rockies had a difficult time getting outs in 2023. Injuries played a big role and starters German Marquez and Antonio Senzatela will miss most, if not all of 2024 following Tommy John surgery. Former closer Daniel Bard suffered a freak injury while playing catch and needed surgery to repair a torn meniscus. Of the franchise-record 17 starting pitchers that were used last season, most of the familiar faces who pitched the most for the Rockies are gone. Kyle Freeland returns to his familiar Opening Day and #1 starter spot but he's coming off a rough season that included an ERA above 5.00, a career-high 29 home runs allowed, and a career low K/9 of 5.4. Cal Quantrill had two extremely good seasons with the Guardians but his 2023 campaign didn't go as planned and he was held to 99.2 innings while his ERA soared to a career-worst 5.24. A shoulder injury was the cause of the limited innings and could be the culprit for the ERA, too. The Rockies signed him to a one-year deal following a trade and are hopeful he can regain his confidence in 2024. Austin Gomber, a member of the notorious Nolan Arenado trade, has since pitched 379.0 innings in three seasons with the Rockies, mostly as a starter, but to the tune of a 5.22 ERA although his second half of the season was much better. The other rotation spots are up for grabs and it makes sense that Dakota Hudson would grab one of them after signing a one-year, \$1.5 million deal.

The bullpen situation is even more concerning than the rotation. With Bard expected to miss time, the pitcher to get the nod at closer will be either Justin Lawrence or Tyler Kinley. Lawrence was a rare bright spot in comparison to a bullpen that ranked dead last in MLB in both WHIP and ERA. He made 11 saves as part of his 75 innings of work while posting an ERA of 3.72 and striking out 78 batters. Most of Kinley's 2023 season was lost to injuries. If the rotation becomes a revolving door again in 2024, relievers like Ty Blach and Anthony Molina will be asked to eat up innings. Jake Bird pitched 89.1 innings for the Rockies last season.

### The Bottom Line

Unfortunately, there are still glaring weaknesses in the pitching staff and the lineup still appears to be "power challenged" even in the confines of Coors Field. The goal this year for Colorado should be to avoid the 100-loss mark and to see young players like Ezequiel Tovar and Nolan Jones

continue their promising progressions. The silver lining to a team that won't be competitive is the ability to call up prospects without significant ramifications. The path to future contention runs through the development of young talent. Until then, it's going to be more tough sledding for the Blake Street Bombers.



### PLAYER SPOTLIGHT Nolan Jones - OF

Injuries took their toll on the Rockies in 2023, but the bright side is that it allowed for Nolan Jones to have a prominent role in the lineup, and the former 2016 second round pick made the most of the opportunity and then some. He led the Rockies in WAR (4.3) despite playing in only 106 games. He showed his versatility as a hitter by not only hitting for average (.297) but for power too. He drew plenty of walks too, leading to a very impressive OPS of .931 and he finished fourth in Rookie of the Year voting in the National League. The Rockies are desperate for stability in their ongoing rebuild and Jones' emergence is perfectly timed.

### **PROSPECT TO WATCH Yanquiel Fernandez - OF**

Fernandez' tremendous power is the characteristic that probably has the Rockies organization most excited, but he has since showed off additional abilities in his relatively short time in the minor leagues. He demolished the baseball in High-A Spokane and had 17 home runs and 64 RBI in just 58 games. The move to Double-A came with its challenges and included an uptick in strikeouts, but it's worth noting that he was, on average, 3.8 years younger than the average player at that level. He showed off his strong arm in the outfield at the Futures Game and threw a ball to third that clocked in at a whopping 103.3 mph which would have been the hardest throw by a Rockies outfielder in the Statcast Era (since 2015). He needs to find a way to bring down his strikeout rate, but he could be a heavyweight power hitter for Colorado soon.
